

BEACHES ARE LOCATED WITHIN THE WILLBRIGGIE REGIONAL PARK

Please obey all signs and NSW National Parks regulations, and always remember to stay water safe around the river.

There are no rubbish collection points. Please take all rubbish when you leave.

Bring your own drinking and cooking water.

Access: 4WD vehicles are recommended. Dirt road suitable for caravans and 2WD vehicles in dry weather.

Campervans/RV's are permitted in this area, however not all campgrounds suit these types of vehicles.



1. SWAGGYS BEACH

-34.55728797441602, 145.95509296480336

From Murrumbidgee River Road, turn onto Forest Drive and follow the unsealed road for approximately 2km until you reach the camp ground



2. ALFIES BEACH

-34.55932011682925, 145.95833309315003

From Murrumbidgee River Road, turn onto Forest Drive and follow the unsealed road for approximately 3.5km until you reach the camp ground



3. DOLANS BEACH

-34.56252478889762, 145.96691771240123

From Murrumbidgee River Road, turn onto Forest Drive and follow the unsealed road for approximately 4.5km until you reach the camp ground



4. CLIVES CORNER

-34.56116822717446, 145.9725626744396

From Murrumbidgee River Road, turn onto Forest Drive and follow the unsealed road for approximately 6.5km until you reach the camp ground



5. HORRIES BEACH

-34.562639062100615, 145.97797385450826

From Murrumbidgee River Road, turn onto Forest Drive and follow the unsealed road for approximately 7km until you reach the camp ground



6. PARADISE BEACH

-34.55623243998966, 145.98475655889607

- Coming North – turn left off the Kidman Way onto Carrington Street – Coming South turn right off the Kidman Way onto Carrington Street
- Turn left off Carrington Street onto MacLeay Street
- Travel 700m on King Street, then turn right onto an unsealed road. This is the main entrance to Willbriggie South Park
- Paradise Beach is located approximately 1.2km along the Loop Trail dirt track from the King Street entrance. 4WD vehicles are recommended as not all sections of the track will accommodate 2WD



7. BUNYIP HOLE

-34.55933715105915, 145.98883281955446

- From the Kidman Way turn onto Forest Drive (Opposite the Darlington Point Riverside Caravan Park)
- Follow the unsealed Forest Drive for approximately 5km, past Whittakers Bend, until you reach the campground
- Non flush toilets are available at the Bunyip Hole



8. WHITTAKERS BEND

-34.55880328146148, 145.9922354247019

- Coming North - turn left off the Kidman Way onto Carrington Street - Coming South turn right off the Kidman Way onto Carrington Street



- Turn left off Carrington Street onto MacLeay Street
- Travel 700m on King Street, then turn right onto an unsealed road This is the main entrance to Willbriggie South Park
- Whittakers Bend is located approximately 1km along the dirt track from the King Street entrance.



9. RESERVE BEACH

-34.57634477652784, 146.01002018521694

- Travel along Narrand Street/ Darlington Point Whitton Road and turn onto the unsealed Beach Road located at the 50-100km speed zone sign
- Travel along Beach Road for approximately 1km until you reach the campground



10. LADY JANE BEACH

-34.57992453001088, 146.01500731829486

- Travel along Narrand Street/ Darlington Point Whitton Road and turn onto the unsealed Beach Road located at the 50-100km speed zone sign
- Travel along Beach Road for approximately 2km until you reach the campground



11. BOOMERANG BEACH

-34.582813028402995, 146.02054401264888

- Travel along the Darlington Point Whitton Road for 2km and turn right onto the unsealed Black Box Road
- Travel approximately 2km along Black Box Road and turn right onto Beach Road
- Travel approximately 1km along Beach Road until you reach the campground



12. WARADGERY BEACH

-34.588724868964114, 146.02403578356967

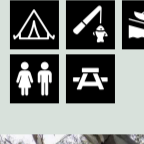
- Travel along the Darlington Point Whitton Road for 2km and turn right onto the unsealed Black Box Road
- Travel approximately 2.5km along Black Box Road and turn right at the Circular Drive intersection
- Travel approximately 1km along Circular Drive until you reach the campground



13. DIGGERS BEACH

-34.59384665367824, 146.0231592467555

- Travel along the Darlington Point Whitton Road for 2km and turn right onto the unsealed Black Box Road
- Travel approximately 3km along Black Box Road and turn right at the Circular Drive intersection
- Travel approximately 1km along Circular Drive until you reach the campground



15. DARLINGTON POINT RIVERSIDE CARAVAN & TOURIST PARK

-34.566873342906709, 146.0028808803586

- From the Kidman Way turn into the Darlington Point Riverside Caravan Park entry (Opposite Forest Drive)
- Before the Bascule Bridge, turn right and follow the sealed road until you reach the unsealed carpark. A boat ramp is located to the right of the carpark
- Ensure to always abide by Town Beach posted signage and stay water safe around the river
- There are no public toilets located at the town beach however visitors staying at the neighbouring caravan park can use the available facilities located within the park.

14. THE POINT BEACH

-34.59822100446022, 146.0289514959694

- Travel along the Darlington Point Whitton Road for 2km and turn right onto the unsealed Black Box Road
- Travel approximately 3.5km along Black Box Road until you reach the campground



16. URI CAMPGROUNDS

-34.56014091515533, 145.93600692313882

- Travel 4km along the unsealed Britts Road.
- Turn left onto Uri Loop Trail for about 3km.
- This is the entrance to the Uri precinct of the park.
- All roads leading to Uri campgrounds are unsealed. 4WD vehicles are recommended when the unsealed access roads are wet. Campervans/RVs are not permitted in this area, due to limited access to turn around safely.

THE MURRUMBIDGEE RIVER

The Murrumbidgee River rises in the Great Dividing Range before flowing through the Australian Capital Territory, where it turns inland and becomes a key waterway of the Murray-Darling Basin. From Burrinjuck Dam, it winds down into the rolling hills around Gundagai and is soon joined by the Tumut River. Continuing its journey, the river flows through Wagga Wagga, Narrandera, Darlington Point and beyond, before finally meeting the Murray River near Boundary Bend.

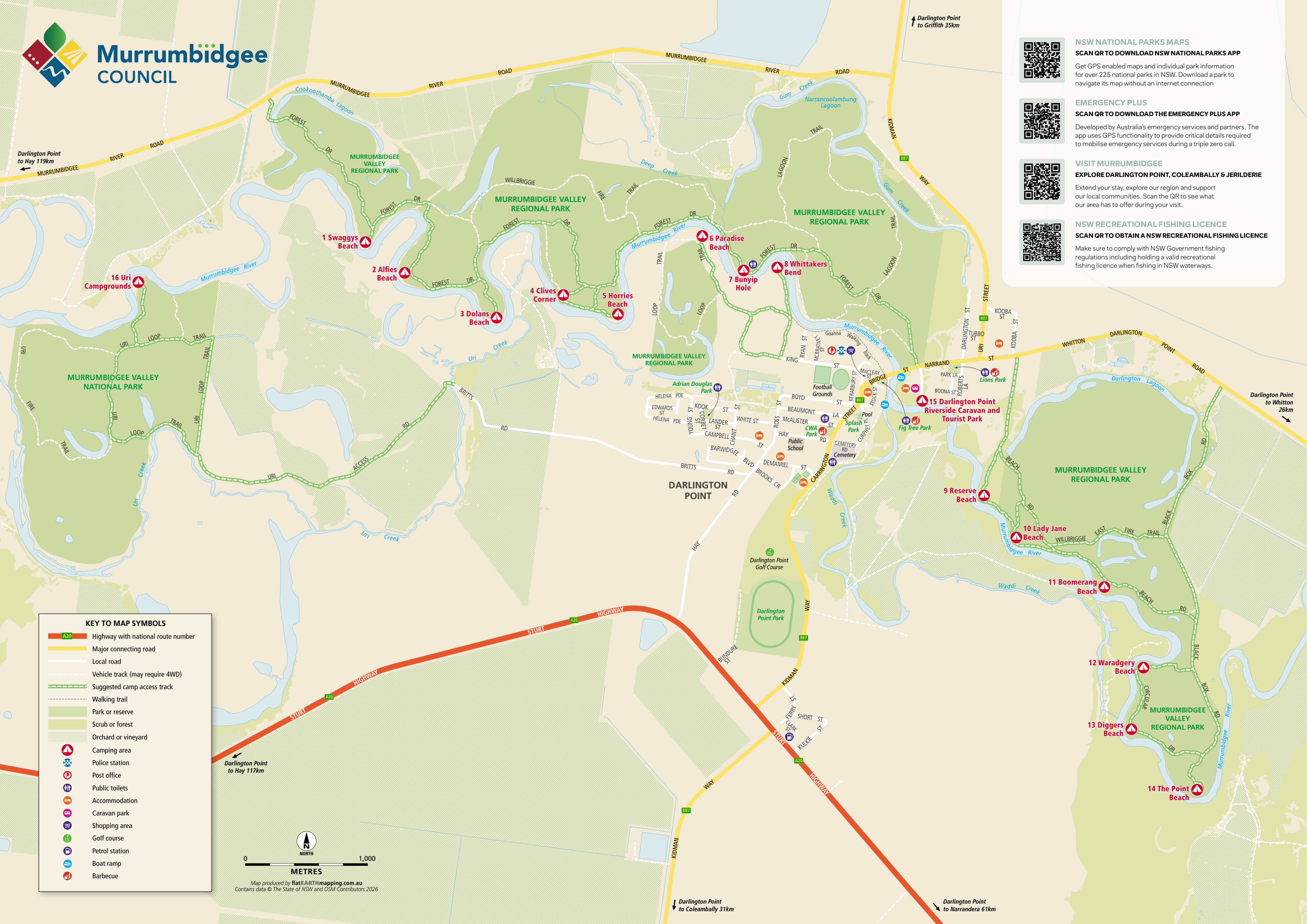
The Murrumbidgee River plays an essential role in supporting agricultural production, carrying water vital for growing citrus, stone fruit, grapes and a range of other crops. It also sustains a diverse array of

native flora and fauna as it winds through some of Australia's hottest and driest landscapes, making it both an ecological and economic lifeline for the region.

Darlington Point is well-known for Murray cod, golden perch, silver perch and native catfish. The river's deep holes, overhanging snags and slow bends make it a favourite among anglers.

Every February, the town hosts the Riverina Classic Catch & Release Fishing Competition, a three-day event supporting charity and helping restock the river with native fingerlings. As a photo-entry competition, large cod can be safely released and still counted, ensuring a healthy, sustainable fishery for the future.
